Town of Midland Audit Committee

Role of the Committee and Membership Criteria

Applicants should include in their application experience that relates to the criteria and why they would like to serve on the Committee

The Audit Committee meets quarterly during regular business hours at the Municipal Office in the Council Chambers. Agendas are circulated typically one week prior to the next scheduled meeting.

As a Committee of Council, the Audit Committee is responsible for overseeing all material aspects of the Corporation's financial reporting, control and audit functions. The role includes a particular focus on the qualitative aspects of financial reporting and on the organization's processes for the management of business/financial risk and for compliance with significant applicable legal, ethical and regulatory requirements. The role also includes maintenance of strong, positive working relationships with management, external auditors and other advisors.

The Audit Committee provides a focal point for communication between Council, the external auditor and management and facilitates an impartial, objective and independent review of management practices.

The Audit Committee is comprised of two Council members and three members of the public appointed for the four-year term of Council.

Consideration will be given to individuals with a business background practicing in accounting or finance.

Committee members should have:

- (1) knowledge of the municipal environment in which the corporation operates;
- (2) the ability to read and understand financial statements (internal and external); and
- (3) the ability to understand key business and financial risks and related controls and control processes.



MIDLAND ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

COMMITTEE INFORMATION AND APPLICATION CRITERIA

The Active Transportation Advisory Committee meets a minimum of five times per year on the third Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. at the North Simcoe Sports and Recreation Centre. Agendas are typically circulated one to two weeks in advance of the meeting.

The goals and objectives are:

Goals:

- To promote Active Transportation methods in the Town of Midland.
- To encourage citizens to choose Active Transportation methods.
- To influence local public policy and planning in support of Active Transportation.
- To advise Council on Active Transportation in relation to budget, infrastructure, education, policy and public awareness.
- To support the local economy and enhance tourism.
- To create an Active Transportation network that accommodates a range of Active Transportation methods.
- To improve existing conditions and reduce risks for all Active Transportation users, regardless of age, skill or ability.
- To encourage partnerships with local organizations who share a common vision of Active Transportation.
- To encourage Active Transportation linkages with the Town of Midland.

Objectives:

- Provide citizens of the Town of Midland with the information that they need about Active Transportation methods.
- Ensure new and existing/established developments are pedestrian oriented.
- Increase awareness of the need and benefits of Active Transportation within the Town of Midland.

Members are encouraged to have interest and knowledge relating to Active Transportation.

This Committee is comprised of seven members, with one being a member of Council, one Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit representative, and five members appointed by Council for a duration consistent with the appointing Council's term of office.



MIDLAND YOUTH COMMITTEE

COMMITTEE INFORMATION AND APPLICATION CRITERIA

The Town of Midland Youth Committee (MYC) was established for the purpose of engaging youth in the process of providing recommendations and advocating for youth within the Town.

The MYC will act a liaison for youth, and will advise on ways to enrich and enhance the health and quality of life of youth within the Town of Midland. The MYC shall:

- solicit input and act as a public forum for issues that affect youth
- provide advice based on input received to improve the programs, policies and services provided to youth,
- research and gather information on youth programs and services, and opportunities for external funding,
- coordinate youth programs and services in the community on behalf of the Town or in partnership with other youth organizations,
- prepare promotional materials
- organize/participate in events to promote or assist youth and assist Council with the creation of a youth engagement strategy.

The Committee shall meet monthly on the first Wednesday at 5:15 pm at the Municipal Office. There will be no meetings held during the months of July and August.

The Committee is comprised of 14 members consisting of five youth (Grades 7 and 8), six youth (Grades 9 to 12), one public member, one youth under the age of 18 (non-resident), and one member of Council.

Youth appointees will serve for a term of one to two years depending on the requirements of the member. The public and Council member appointees shall serve a four year term consistent with the appointing Council's Term of Office.

The Town promotes equal participation and gender parity, and believes the interests of all genders would be best represented by equal representation on the Committee.
