Midland Community Safety Task Force Wants Your Feedback

(MIDLAND, ON) – The Town of Midland’s newly-formed Community Safety Task Force is bringing the community together to identify and address the safety issues facing our downtown.

“We are asking residents to provide their feedback on safety in the downtown, and what issues they’ve encountered,” said Mayor Gord McKay. “We are using a multi-pronged approach. We have launched an online survey that residents can participate in, and we are also holding a public Town Hall meeting that residents are invited to attend.”

The results of the survey and feedback from the Town Hall meeting will be used to develop a Downtown Community Safety Plan that will be presented to Council by August 31, 2018.

The Town Hall meeting will be held on Wednesday, June 20, at St. Paul’s United Church, located at 308 King Street, from 6:30 – 8 p.m.
