



COUNTY COUNCILLORS

INFO FOR CANDIDATES FOR MAYOR AND DEPUTY MAYOR

Under the current County of Simcoe governance structure, those successful in being elected to the office of Mayor and Deputy Mayor in one of the 16 member municipalities (lower-tier) are also automatically elected to serve as a member of Simcoe County Council as a County Councillor. This information sheet is, therefore, intended to provide relevant information regarding the County of Simcoe (upper-tier), the services provided by this level of municipal government and the responsibilities of a Simcoe County Councillor.

COUNTY OF SIMCOE

- Consists of:
 - Seven Towns
Bradford West Gwillimbury, Collingwood, Innisfil, Midland, New Tecumseth, Penetanguishene, and Wasaga Beach
 - Nine Townships
Adjala-Tosorontio, Clearview, Essa, Oro-Medonte, Ramara, Severn, Springwater, Tay, and Tiny
- 471,700 hectares (4,717 sq. km or 1,165,596 acres) make up the County of Simcoe
- Second largest County based on population and third largest County in Ontario based on physical size
- Total County population (2016 Census Canada):
 - 302,908 (est.) excluding Barrie and Orillia
 - 479,650 (est.) including Barrie and Orillia
- Approximately 13,089 hectares (32,150 acres) of County-owned/managed forests
- 850 km of roads, 1,691 lane kms and more than 200 bridges and structures
- More than 1,650 full- and part-time employees

OPERATING AND CAPITAL BUDGET

The County's 2018 operating and capital budget is approximately \$510 million.

Although the County provides a range of cost shared services to both the cities of Barrie and Orillia, they are politically and administratively separate from the County. Representatives from the Cities of Barrie and Orillia are invited to participate in decision-making at relevant County committees related to those shared services.



COUNTY GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE

The Mayors and Deputy Mayors from the 16 member municipalities make up Simcoe County Council. The total composition of County Council is 32.

At an Inaugural meeting in the first and third year of a Council term, Council elects from amongst the membership a Head of Council (Warden) as well as a Deputy Warden.

While sitting as a member of County Council, councillors consider and make decisions regarding County services that are in the best interests of the residents of the County as a whole.

The County of Simcoe uses a system involving weighted votes (which is based on the electoral size of each member municipality) when recorded votes are taken in meetings.

COUNTY OF SIMCOE COUNCIL / COMMITTEE / BOARD MEETINGS

All members of County Council are required to attend regular and special meetings of County Council and its Committees, as well as any advisory or special purpose committees, boards, or commissions to which they are appointed.

With few exceptions, such as July and December, there are a minimum of two regular Committee/Council meetings each month which are held in the Council Chambers, County of Simcoe Administration Centre, 1110 Highway 26, Midhurst. Regular and special meetings of both Council and Committees occur during the day.

COUNCIL ORIENTATION

If elected, local Mayors and Deputy Mayors will be provided a significant orientation session to further inform and prepare them for their responsibilities as County Councillors.
