2) How can YOU stop the spread of COVID-19

- **Before you leave for work each day**, ask yourself the COVID-19 Self-Screening questions. (see attached poster as reference)
 - If you are experiencing more than one of the COVID-19 Symptoms, stay home.
 - Contact your Manager or Supervisor immediately
 - If you think you may or have been exposed to COVID-19 call for an appointment to be tested.
- **Everyday**: Wash hands frequently, maintain a physical distance of 2 metres or wear a mask, limit your social circle to that recommended by the health unit.





3) Flu Clinics

- With the Premier's announcement this week the Town would like to encourage employees to get the flu shot.
- Details have not yet been released when in October and where here in Midland the flu shots will be available, however we want to encourage employees to get the flu shot.
- The Town has been approached by the local health network about the possibility of using the NSSRC as a mass flu vaccination clinic. Stay tuned for more information.
