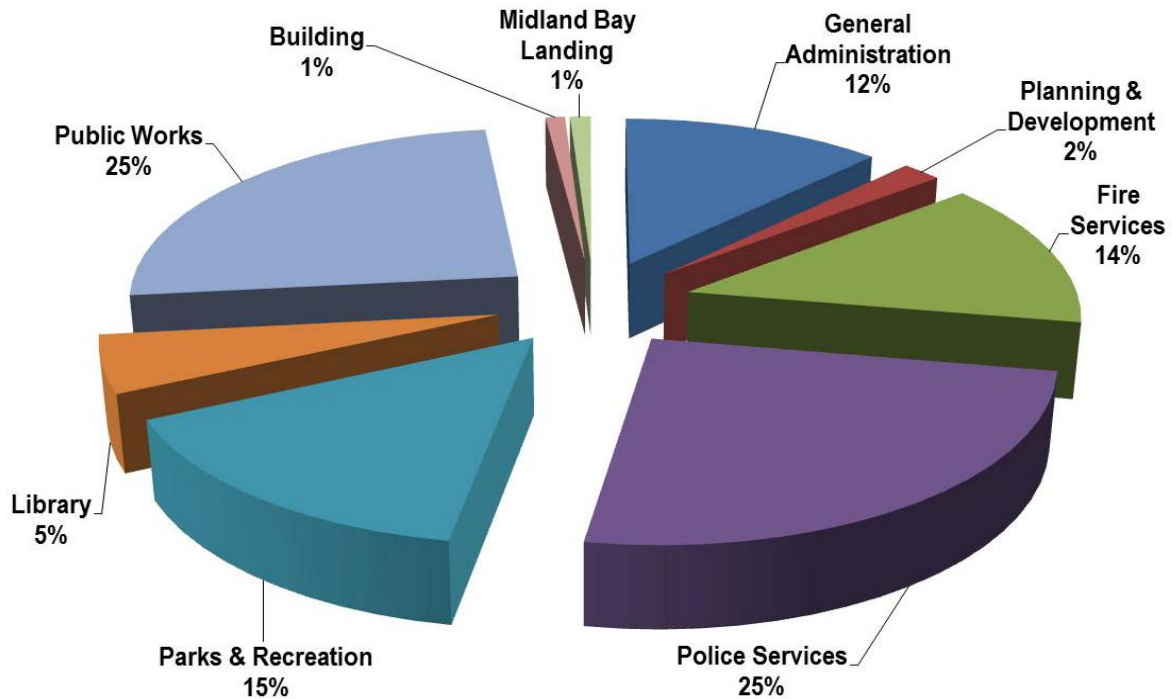




Town of Midland 2014 Taxes

Tax Levy Requirement by Department



Administration - \$2,329,588

- Council, CAO, Clerk, Treasury, Tax Department, Purchasing, Human Resources, Payroll, Records Management, IT, Health & Safety, Animal Control.
- By-Law administration and enforcement.
- Support to the Museum, Airport, Hospital, Physician Recruitment and Street Outreach Services.

Planning & Development - \$355,055

- Administration of Town Official Plan, Zoning By-law and Provincial legislation.
- Manages local planning review process for all development applications.
- Responsible for Economic Development activities and coordination with the Huronia Economic Alliance.
- Responsible for Committee of Adjustment and Sign Variance Committee.
- Midland Heritage Committee.

Building Services - \$173,693

- Building Services is responsible for the receipt and issuance of building permit applications and inspections as part of the regulation and enforcement of the Ontario Building Code.

Police Services - \$4,701,109

- Incidents have risen 15 % since 2011.
- Between 2011 and 2013 the number of crimes committed dropped 43% including a 53% reduction in youth crime.
- In 2013 Midland Police solved 90% of violent crime incidents, up 9% from 2011.
- Enforcement of traffic offences is 48% higher than in 2007 and motor vehicles collisions dropped 36%.
- Radio communications for all Town of Midland services.
- Court security for the Ontario Court of Justice located in Midland.

Library- \$1,005,496

Fire Services - \$2,580,305

- Fire Protection, Rescue, Medical Assists, Public Services, Hazardous Materials, Fire Prevention and Inspection, Public Education.
- 2013 statistics: 1072 emergency calls, 2403 hours of fire fighter training, 174 fire inspections, 31 new construction plans reviewed.
- Emergency Management Program administration.

Municipal Parking spending of \$218,871 is fully funded from parking revenues.

Public Works - \$4,711,851

- Public Works Equipment, Transit, Street Lighting, Engineering, Storm Sewers, Road and Sidewalk Maintenance and Construction.
- Includes \$3M in Capital Expenditures.

Water & Sewer Services—Billed Separately

Total Spending: \$6,306,071

Billed Revenue: \$6,404,032

Includes \$1.1M in Capital Expenditures

- Separate water and sewer invoices are issued based on volume of water used.

Bulky Item Collection

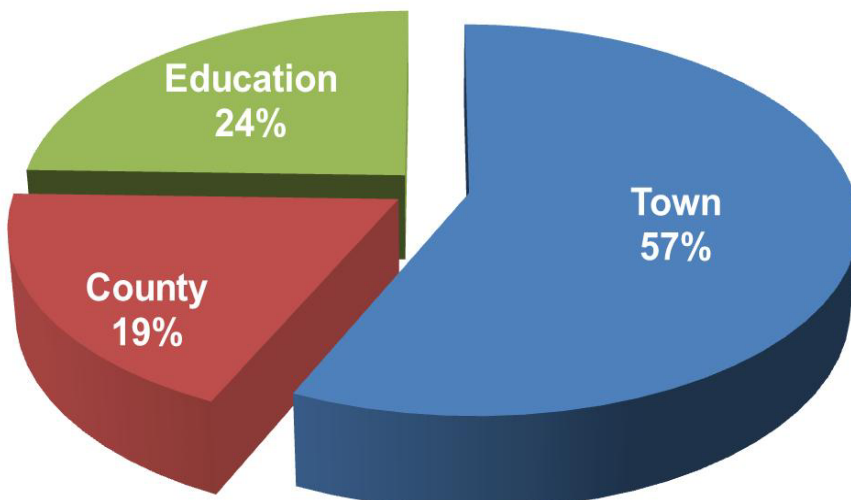
The County of Simcoe has discontinued the use of garbage vouchers and replaced it with a new service that will provide residents with a convenient, cost effective means to dispose of up to five bulky items at a user-

pay cost of \$35. This model ensures only those locations using the service are paying for it. The call-in bulky collection service will allow the diversion of approximately 60 per cent of the material normally collected in a bulky service, which

currently only diverts four per cent of material collected. Bulky item collection is now available across the County from June until September.
