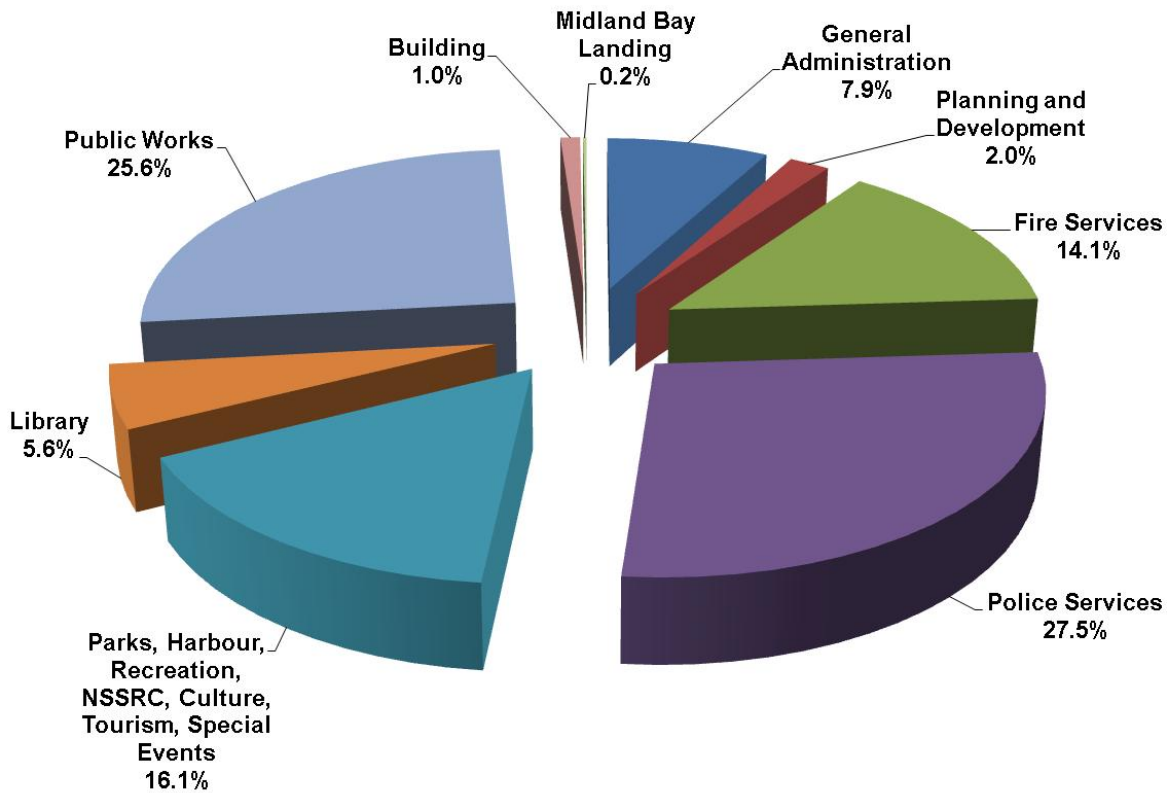




Town of Midland 2015 Taxes

Tax Levy Requirement by Department



Administration

- Council, CAO, Clerk, Treasury, Tax Department, Purchasing, Human Resources, Payroll, Records Management, IT, Health & Safety, Animal Control.
- By-Law administration and enforcement.
- Support to the Museum, Airport, Hospital, Physician Recruitment and Street Outreach Services.

Planning & Development

- Administration of Town Official Plan, Zoning By-law and Provincial legislation.
- Manages local planning review process for all development applications.
- Responsible for Economic Development activities and coordination with the Huronia Economic Alliance.
- Responsible for Committee of Adjustment and Sign Variance Committee.
- Midland Heritage Committee.

Building Services

- Building Services is responsible for the receipt and issuance of building permit applications and inspections as part of the regulation and enforcement of the Ontario Building Code.

Police Services

- Calls for service decreased 6% between 2011 and 2014.
- Between 2011 and 2014 the number of reported criminal occurrences decreased 61%. Traffic enforcement 32% higher than in 2007.
- Auxiliary complement of 10 officers who volunteer their time in the community.
- Cram-A-Cruiser event for the local food bank raised 12,000 lbs of food, \$4,900 in cash donations as well as toys.

Fire Services

- Fire Protection, Rescue, Medical Assists, Public Services, Hazardous Materials, Fire Prevention and Inspection, Public Education.
- 2014 statistics: 1127 emergency calls, 1625 hours of fire fighter training, 105 fire inspections, 26 new construction plans reviewed.
- Emergency Management Program administration.

Public Works

- Public Works Equipment, Transit, Street Lighting, Engineering, Storm Sewers, Road and Sidewalk Maintenance and Construction.

BULKY ITEM COLLECTION

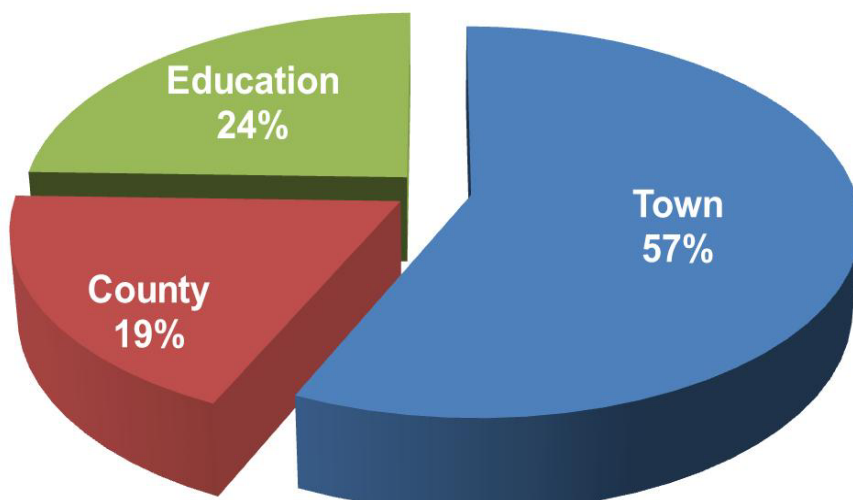
